POLICE SURGERIES

PC820 B WILSON & PCSO 7030 C ASANTE-AMPADUH held a POLICE SURGERY with the BEAT BUS on FRIDAY 16th JUNE 2023 between 13:00Hrs x 15:00Hrs on MAIN STREET, MIDDLETON. This was only attended by two persons, with no issues reported just general chat.

Mr Roberston also reported from the recent PLR annual liaison meeting. Parish councils can now apply for ATC's (strips measuriung number and speed of vehicles) via the Northamptonshire Police new road policing unit directly and that from 3rd July the Northamptonshire Neighbourhood Alert had changed to Northamptonshire Talking.

The Council referred to correspondence from a local resident regarding the car which has been abandoned outside a neighbour's property in Glover Court and is parked such as it causes a problem to residents, delivery lorries and the dustbin men. Mr Robertson advised that PC Wilson had agreed to look into this and if the vehicle is felt to be unroadworthy it will be lifted and taken away under the ELVIS scheme. The Council **agreed** to write to the owner if this vehicle is not removed requesting that it is parked considerately and does not impede residents and vehicles accessing Glover Court (action JM).

7. Orchard and Open Space:

There was nothing to report on this item.

8. Highways, Signage, Footpaths, Grit Bins, Lighting:

A damaged drain cover on The Hill, which is especially hazardous to horse riders, was brought to the Council's attention. The Chair will report via Fix My Street (action SC).

9. Safety Review of Parish Assets:

It was noted that all assets, apart from the flaking varnish on one of the orchard benches, were all in order. This bench is awaiting refurbishment.

The Defibrillator had been checked and is in order.

10. Changes to Ward Boundaries:

The Council considered the Boundary Commission recommendations on changes to the unitary ward boundaries which proposed Middleton along with East Carlton, Rockingham and Cotingham be included in the Desborough Ward. The Council felt that it would be of benefit to Middleton to sit in a ward with the neighbouring villages and agreed not to repond to the consultation.

11. Planning:

There were no planning applications to discuss.

The Chair circulated notes from a recent meeting with NNC Planning and Enforcement Officers and a representative from RAG to discuss the Oakley Park conditions and the Peasedale Hill appeal. The provisional date of Peasedale Hill appealis 7/8th November, to be confirmed.
